# <u>Hazelgrove Elementary PAC Meeting Minutes</u> October 2, 2018

- Called to order at 7:00 PM.
- Adoption of previous minutes by Sarah Macleod and Karlee Pighin.

## • Fundraising Report:

- School Start: 296 student orders; donation option on the site: \$160.00 gained; no issues with the orders.
- o Marketplace in Wednesday, November 21, 2018 4:30-8:30
  - Concession and bake sale will also happen like last year
- Santa Breakfast
  - Looking for a co-chair for the Santa Breakfast
  - December 1, 2018
- o Fun Fair in June
  - First Friday in June 2019
- Giant tickets fundraiser: Buy tickets for \$14 and resell them at \$20.
  - 50/50 tickets this year if we sell 300 tickets (\$4200) make a profit \$2100. Plus any profits from the 50/50. We need to sell enough tickets to get to sell the 50/50.
  - Our target is to sell 210 tickets to break even
  - Date given is Sunday, November 18, 2018
  - This will be a skate after the game
  - 50/50 we will need adult volunteers (be there 2 hours there ahead of time)
  - Last year we sold 233 for one game selling them on two different dates.
- Purdy's proposed to go out end of October/beginning of November

### • Treasurer's Report:

- Gaming Account balance: \$30,875.36 with \$17,928.00 that we have applied for and will receive in October
- o Regular Account balance: \$26,440.70

## • Hot Lunch Report:

- Hot lunch is up and running
  - October to December
  - January to Spring Break
  - Spring Break to June
- o It will be every 3<sup>rd</sup> week instead of every 2<sup>nd</sup> week
- Hot dogs are on Friday
- o Kindergartens are eating early so we need volunteers at 11:30 AM
- We will be doing hot dog (beef & veggie) this year currently at 300 hot dogs
- We are looking at new vendors for Hot Lunch:
- If you have a vendor in mind: need to be nut-free; and they need to deliver please contact the PAC

## • Principal's report:

- Meet the teacher
- Book fair profitable: \$1400 worth of books were purchased for the library
- Terry Fox Run: Teacher- Johnson and Meyer: organized the run and goal was to raise \$5,000 and they earned \$6,900. Students get an extra recess break for reaching their goal.
- o Enrolment: up by 3 divisions at 36 divisions 825 students
- 3 new teachers and staffing is complete
- o All divisions fit into the class size and composition
- 3 new portables: which will be next to the other portable so the classes in the library will not have a classroom
- Two report systems: open to having conferences with teachers and parents
- Cross country is up and running: 60 students and PAC paid for the bus for the track meet
- Thank you to teacher coaches for supporting the track team
- Teacher's wish list:
  - Busses: every grade having a bus
  - Classroom discretionary funds: \$5/per student to classroom
  - Grade 7 traditional trips: Cultas Lake trip
  - ADST projects: need funds
  - Discussion about getting lump sums to the school and that way there is no wait for supplies for projects and clubs. \$3,000.000
  - Principal is asking teachers to come to P and VP to ask for items
  - Would like to bring a parent presentation: Colleen Drewbo- on the topics of social emotional learning, mental health, anxiety, resiliency of coping, oppositional defiant students. Principal and VP could contact: perhaps \$1000.00 and we could split the cost with another school

RBC: gave a grant of \$1000.00. MOTION to put this funds to ADST program: Motion put forward to give school funds for ADST program \$3,000.00: \$1,000 grant and \$2,000 from Gaming Account: APPROVED.

### NEW BUSINESS

- DPAC Election: Jodi Yuzik is elected as the DPAC.
- o Surrey Community Grant: was not offered last year.
- o Teacher appreciation welcome back: Starbucks, Tea & Coffee, and Cobs. Alyssa will run.
